### Expertise, Resources and Services

---

NDIF possesses expertise in both deposit insurance and failed bank resolutions. This includes seasoned staff in different core competencies working with the agency since its inception in 1993. Deposit insurance experience covers all phases of development, operation and administration, and in particular payout operations, but excluding differential premium assessments. NDIF had also dealt with several challenging resolutions based on a broad cost-minimizing mandate prior to converting into a pay-box scheme in 2005. Personnel include three managers with English speaking skills.

NDIF offers expert consultation in the form of advising, critiquing, evaluating, reporting, and meetings. NDIF may also make available speakers for select topics at training venues sponsored by others.

### Objectives, Priorities and Financing

---

NDIF welcomes interests in the deposit insurance framework defined by European Union Directives. This most often translates into working with European countries and nearby jurisdictions, but NDIF is open to working with other countries and jurisdictions as well.

NDIF requires mission funding from the recipient or third-party sponsors due to resource considerations.

---

Requests should specify type of capacity building services, mission objective, time frame, expected products, mission financing and translation requirements.

### Alternatives Hosted by the Provider

---

NDIF hosts visiting officials on a periodic basis, primarily from Europe but including the Middle East and elsewhere. Visits usually involve up to 3-4 individuals ranging from 1 to 4 days at a time. NDIF requires minimum advance notice of one month and visitors not speaking English should arrange for translators beforehand.

NDIF may also be willing to host special assignments on a limited case-by-case basis, such as on-the-job training or on-site observers, subject to advance notice and arrangements.

In-house training and hosting special events are not available.
